This permit allows for a **non-licensed** plumber to perform work consisting of installing, servicing, or repairing service mains or service lines that provide water or sewer services on private property in an area that extends from a public right-of-way or public easement to not less than 5 feet from a building or structure. This permit will only pertain to commercial properties and will not be allowed for grease traps, backflow devices, lift stations, or grinder stations. A Water/Wastewater inspection will be required by AW.
